### Art-Net

Artistic Licence (UK) Ltd has released a new revision of the Art-Net Ethernet protocol. Art-Net was originally developed as a 'stop-gap' solution whilst the industry awaited the release of ESTA's Advanced Control Network Protocol (ACN).

Art-Net has now been implemented by a number of leading manufacturers and the latest revision reflects feedback from their requirements.

Art-Net is a TCP/IP protocol that provides a mechanism for transferring DMX512, triggering and console video monitor data over 10BaseT Ethernet cable.

The Artistic Licence product DMX-Hub implements the Art-Net Protocol and provides input and output for four universes of DMX512. DMX-Hub can be used as a peripheral to a lighting console that outputs Art-Net or multiple units can be used to transfer DMX512 over Ethernet.

In conjunction with the revised protocol, Artistic Licence has released a software product: 'Art-Net View' which, as the name suggests is a test and analysis program for Art-Net. The software runs under Windows 95 and Windows 98 and uses a standard Ethernet card for the Art-Net interface.
