Using Windows 7/8 or Vista in XP Compatibility Mode

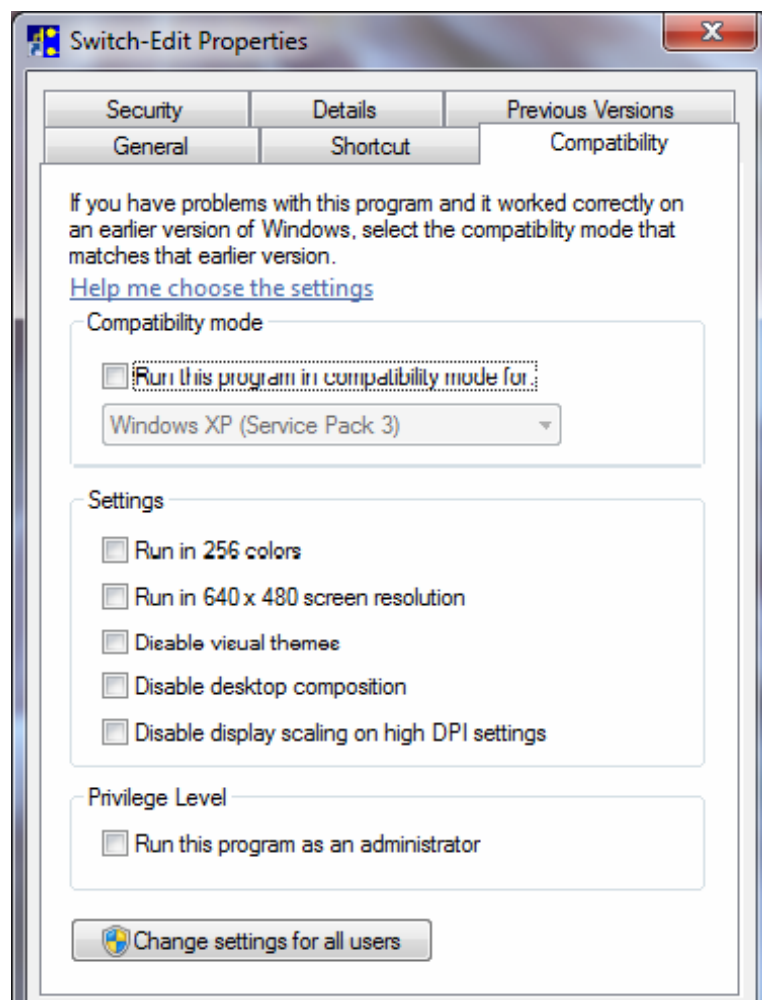
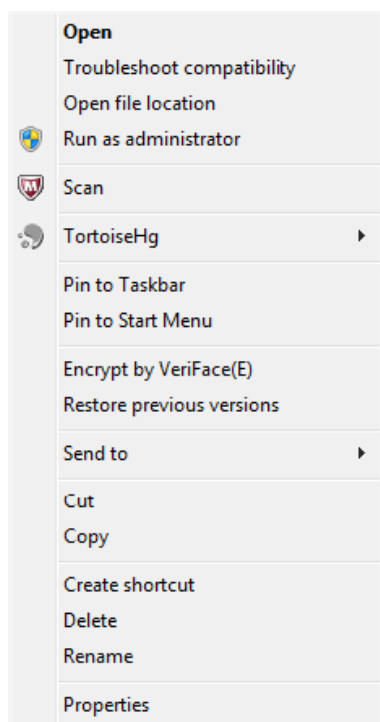
After Windows XP, Microsoft significantly changed the way in which application software can communicate with Windows. This means that in Vista, Windows 7 and Windows 8, our software products must be run in a special mode. This mode is called Windows XP compatibility mode with administrator rights.

To configure the compatibility mode for an application, just locate the installation directory and right click on the .exe. You can also right click on the desktop shortcut.

A menu will appear. Select Properties. Select the Compatibility Tab and click on “Change Settings for all users”.

Now tick: “Run as administrator”.

Next, tick: “Run this program in compatibility mode for” and select “Windows XP Service Pack 3”.



Display settings will vary depending on the computer. First try running with no display settings selected. If there is a display problem, try checking the bottom 3 disable options and running in 256 colours.

Running in this mode will allow Artistic Licence programs to operate on Windows Vista, 7, 8.
